


**Selectmen's Meeting

- Reviewed Clear Blue Technologies Smart off-grid solar and wind power solution to high energy costs, called ILLUMIENT.
- Notice from Central Maine Power of an average 1.3% price cut on delivery service for Residential Rate A customers. This cut is driven by Federal tax law changes and the settlement of all costs related to the October Windstorm—and passed the savings on to customers.

Other Business:

- The Selectmen went over the Action Plan for Risk Management and asked Carol to contact Jim Small, JR. Card, John Lambert and Richard Bates to get the work done that is needed.
- Tom Garrepy was in and said they will be looking at buying a drone for the Fire Dept. He estimated the cost will be \$4000 to \$5000. He also told Marc that he would get together with him in a couple weeks to let him know when they will be doing training with jaws of life on cars.
